In addition I served on the Anne Arundel County Superintendent's Teen Advisory. Contestants must arrive at the Maryland Yacht Club by 8:30am on Saturday, June 15, 2024, for interviews.

- Dress Code: <u>Professional business attire</u>, tiara, and sash
- Prior to the start of the interviews, a <u>drawing</u> will be conducted to <u>determine the contestants' position order</u> for Interview Day and Pageant Day.
- Judges questions will be based on information provided in the packet, including the elevator pitch.
- Contestants will also <u>choose Miss Congeniality</u> from the pool of princesses by secret ballot.
- Contestants turn in their Penny War Jars and collected funds.





Friday, June 21, 2024:

- <u>5:00pm</u>: Pageant participants arrive at MYC for Pageant Rehearsal. Pageant escorts (Commodores) attendance is required. Bring your pageant shoes to practice the pageant walks.
- <u>6:00pm-9:00pm:</u> Following pageant rehearsal, there will be a <u>Queen's Farewell Pool Party with music</u>. An a la carte menu will be available. No RSVP required.





Pageant Day: Saturday, June 22, 2024

- <u>7:30am-10:30am:</u> Clubs set up and decorate tents. <u>Tent sizes up to 10'x10' are allowed</u>. Set-up locations will be designated by marked paint sticks behind the pageant seating. Tents will be organized in alphabetical order by club name.
- <u>9:00am-10:30am:</u> Visitors may purchase breakfast on the MYC side patio.
- <u>9:30am-10:30am:</u> Princess Breakfast in the MYC Board Room.
- 10:30am-11:00am: Contestants judge decorated boats and tents.

Required Contestant Attire

- Two long formal gowns to be selected by the Contestant.
 - One white gown, and one your choice of color.
 - The gown must be tasteful without low cuts in the front or back nor high slits in the front or sides.
 - If a strapless is chosen, please ensure proper fit to prevent any discomfort or adjusting during presentation and while on state.
